Notes/Comments: (1) Students must complete MATH 1314, MATH 1350 and MATH 1351 with a grade of "C" or better to receive transfer credit for MATH 3381. If ALL three MATH courses are NOT completed with a grade of "C" or better, the student will be REQUIRED to complete MATH 3381 at SHSU. Math 1314 is a prerequisite to MATH 1350 and MATH 1351 and is also required for completion of the AAT degree. Students can take the CLEP to earn credit for Math 1314. (2) Degree requires PHYS 1305/1105, BIOL 1408, and BIOL 1436. Note: BIOL 1436 can be substituted by 4 hours of Life & Physical Sciences from Lee College. (3) SPED 2301 is a prerequisite for SPED 3301. (4) ENGL 2332 OR ENGL 2333 satisfies the Core Curriculum requirement for Component Area IV (Language, Philosophy, and Culture) as well as the major. (5) READ 3315 and READ 3380 are prerequisites for READ blocks. (6) BESL 3301 is a prerequisite for TESL 3313. (7) CIEE 3385 is best taken with Field block 1 or Field block 2. The course can be taken during another semester to obtain full time status. Field experiences required. (8) ECHE 4343 is best taken with Field Block 1 or Field Block 2. The course can be taken in other semesters to obtain full time status. Active Field Experience in Kindergarten or Pre-Kindergarten is required during the semester taken. *See academic advisor regarding TECA courses.
