- 1. Choose and investigate your topic
 - Need help selecting a topic? Get ideas by browsing the databases on the library home page.
 - Investigate your topic using an encyclopedia.
- 2. Look in other reference books for scholarly information on your topic. Good choices include:
 - Credo
 - Gale Virtual Reference Library
 - Reference Universe to search the indexes and tables of contents of print titles in the library.
- 3. Use the <u>library catalog</u> to find books on your topic.

- 4. Use Federal, State, and local government documents.
- 5. Use the Research Databases to find articles on your topic.
