Certified Nurse Aide



Prepare for entry level nursing assistant positions through our 104-hour Certified Nurse Aide program. You will achieve a level of skills and abilities essential to provide basic care to residents of long-term care facilities. Topics include residents' rights, communication, observation, reporting, and assisting residents in maintaining basic comfort and safety.

Emphasis will be on effective interaction with members of the health care team. Also, as a student, you will communicate with residents and their families with sensitivity to their psychosocial needs and assist residents in attaining and maintaining maximum functional independence. The clinical will provide a method of instruction providing detailed education, training and work-based experience and direct patient/client care, generally at a clinical site. Our approved program will provide you with 68 hours of lecture/lab and 40 hours of clinical experience. Basic HIPAA training will be included.

Certificates of completion will be awarded and is a separate process from the official certification issued by the state. For official Certification, the written and skills test will be given off-site through Prometric.

Estimated Tuition

Cost of program is \$805. Tuition must be paid in full by the first day of class.

Additional costs include an online background check (\$42, payable by student), drug screen (\$40, payable by student), compliance tracker (\$30, payable by student), textbooks, and supplies.

Steps to Application

- Complete the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.gov
- Create a Complio account at <u>www.leecompliance.com</u> to begin the Background Investigation and Drug Screen process.
- Upload all required documents to your Complio account.

Admission Requirements

ALL requirements **MUST** be completed **ONE WEEK BEFORE** the start of class, including online background check, high school diploma or GED, copy of Social Security card, state-issued ID or TDL (Names MUST match), and all immunization requirements.

- Online Background Investigation (\$42), Drug Screen (\$40), and Compliance Tracker (\$30) must be paid for and started by the student at http://leecompliance.com. The password for the Compliance Tracker is LC2022. The results take 48-72 hours.
- High School Diploma or GED
- Copy of Social Security card AND a State-Issued ID or TDL (Names MUST match)
- Current BLS CPR (Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers from American Heart Association)
- It is required that students obtain and maintain personal health insurance while in the program. Acceptable personal health insurance must meet Minimum Essential Coverage (MEC).
- Hepatitis B Series of Three doses are required or a Quantitative Titer will be accepted as long as the result shows positive immunity.
- MMR Must have two doses of vaccination. Titer accepted.
- TB Skin Test (PPD) Test must be negative and taken within 12 months of the
 end date of clinical rotations. If positive, chest X-ray with written results from a
 doctor showing no symptoms of TB accepted OR Chest X-ray with written results
 within 2 years of the start date of class OR Quan ti FERON® TB Gold Blood
 Test.
- Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis (TDaP) Must be within 10 years of the end date of the class.
- Varicella Must have two doses of vaccination or titer test with positive results.
- Flu Vaccine annual if clinical rotations are to be completed during flu season.
 (Oct.-March)

Check Eligibility for Licensing Exams

Students who have a felony conviction should check with the Program Manager of their program to determine if a licensing exam is required to be employed. Some examples include, but are not limited to, education, nursing, cosmetology, and technology programs. Legislative changes, specifically, HB 1508 from the 85th Texas legislative session section 53.151 (2017), require notification to applicants and enrollees regarding the consequences of a criminal conviction on eligibility for an occupational license. Students may be ineligible for an occupational license upon completion of a program due to prior convictions.
