
## **Political Science**

The study of political science is the study of government and politics. It is a social science dealing with systems of governance and power, and the analysis of political activities, political thought, political behavior, and associated constitutions and laws.

Students should work with their advisor to tailor course selections to align with their chosen transfer university. The transfer plan on this page shows a tailored example for a university commonly chosen by Lee College students. However, students may choose to continue their education at any university.

#### What Will I Learn?

Students will gain a basic understanding of political science through the study of historical events, governing institutions, human behavior and economic development. A concentration in Political Science prepares graduates for transfer to a four-year institution. It paves the way for students to pursue a bachelor of arts degree in a field related to Political Science at most state universities in Texas.

### What Can I Do with This Course of Study?

An advanced degree in Social Sciences can lead to a variety of different careers, such as:

#### **Political Science UH Transfer Plan**

This plan includes course options for transferring into a Political Science BA at UH. The plan includes less than the 60 hours required for an Associate of Arts. Students need to complete additional associate degree requirements or use reverse transfer to complete their Associate of Arts.
